





## **COVID-19 Vaccines for People with Medicare**



What does it cost? You pay nothing for the vaccine!



Where do I get it? COVID-19 vaccines are available at pharmacies, clinics, doctors' offices, hospitals, or even in the home. Find a vaccine near you at <a href="https://www.vaccines.gov">www.vaccines.gov</a>.



What do I bring? Bring your red, white, and blue Medicare card to your appointment, even if you have a Medicare Advantage Plan. Otherwise, you may be asked for your Social Security number to verify you're on Medicare.



**Already vaccinated?** A booster is recommended for people aged 12 and over, and especially for older adults. Speak with your doctor if you have concerns.

**Undecided?** Older adults are highly at risk from COVID-19. Over 80% of Americans 65 and older are vaccinated, but it could be lower where you live. Learn more about the vaccine at <a href="www.cdc.gov/coronavirus">www.cdc.gov/coronavirus</a>.
