





COVID-19 Vaccines for People with Medicare

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What does it cost? You pay nothing for the vaccine!



Where do I get it? COVID-19 vaccines are available at pharmacies, clinics, doctors' offices, hospitals, or even in the home. Find a vaccine near you at <u>www.vaccines.gov</u>.



What do I bring? Bring your red, white, and blue Medicare card to your appointment, even if you have a Medicare Advantage Plan. Otherwise, you may be asked for your Social Security number to verify you're on Medicare.



Already vaccinated? Boosters are recommended for most people, and especially for older adults. Speak with your doctor if you have questions.

Undecided? Older adults are highly at risk from COVID-19. Most Americans age 65 and older are vaccinated. Learn more about the vaccine's effectiveness at <u>www.cdc.gov/coronavirus</u>.
